


The 7th Framework Programme of research Main new elements of FP7 compared to FP6

- Duration increased from five to seven years (except for Euratom FP)
- □ Annual budget increased significantly
- □ Basic research (~ €1 billion per year) and ERC
- □ New structure: cooperation, ideas, people, capacities
- □ Simpler procedures
- □ ERA-NET (coordination national programmes, Art. 169) can be part of the Themes
- □ FP7 topics should integrate within the research activity itself (e.g. coordinated calls)

A new approach to support International Cooperation

- The theme—oriented international cooperation actions are carried out under the Cooperation Specific Programme with:
 - the **opening of all activities to third countries** both for ICPC and industrialised countries in the Themes &
 - the introduction of Specific international co-operation actions (SICAs) dedicated to ICPCs.
- The international actions in the area of human potential are carried out under the People Specific Programme
- INCO actions of the Capacity Specific Programme are designed to
 - identify S&T priorities with Third Countries,
 - reinforce the participation of these countries in FP7
 - promote a co-ordinated approach among MS to S&T international Cooperation.
- Also the Ideas Specific Programme is open to 3rd Cuntries.



THIRD COUNTRIES

- 1- Associated countries (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, Israel, Turkey, WBCs)
 - Same prerogatives as Member States
- 2- International Cooperation Partner Countries (ICPC):
 - Countries neighbouring the EU: Mediterranean Partner Countries (MPC), Western Balkans Countries (WBC), Eastern European and Central Asian countries (EECA)
 - Developing countries: Africa-Caraibbean-Pacific (ACP), ASIA, Latin America)
 - Emerging economies (e.g. China, India, Brazil, Russia, South Africa)
 - ► Can be funded
- 3- Industrialised countries (USA, Canada, Japan, Australia....)
 - Funded only exceptionally






Main objectives of International Cooperation in FP7

- Support Europe competitiveness through strategic partnerships with third countries in selected fields of science, also attracting researchers and resources
- Address specific problems facing third countries on the basis of mutual interest and mutual benefit (e.g. global challenges)
- Use S&T cooperation to reinforce the Community's external relations and other relevant policies, strengthening Europe's role in the world (knowledge, markets, progress)

Mechanisms for implementation of international cooperation

- -"Opening" of all activities and topics of the work programme to international cooperation
- -"Targeted Opening" to the participation of third countries or regions
- -Specific International Cooperation Actions (SICA)
- → Other specific actions such as twinning of projects or joint co-funded projects





Mechanisms Rules of participation

- Opening: all topics of the work programme are open to the participation of applicants from third countries
- Targeted Opening: topics for which the participation of well targeted third countries or regions is explicitly encouraged
 - > The participation of the third country partner is in addition to the legal minimum consortium of
 - ✓ 3 partners from 3 different EU Member States and/or Associated States for collaborative projects
 - ✓ 1 partner from a EU Member State and/or Associated State for Coordination Support Actions



Rules of partecipation Twinning – Coordinated Call

Other Specific actions: topics especially designed for information exchange or for co-funded joint research with targeted third country partners

- >Twinning of existing research projects
 - Coordinated Call for joint research






Rules of participation - SICA

- Specific International Cooperation Actions (SICA): topics especially designed and devoted to the international cooperation with targeted ICPC (International Cooperation Partner Countries)
 - Collaborative Project: The minimum number of participants is 4 partners out of which 2 from different EU Member States and/or Associated States + 2 partners from two different ICPC*
- (*): Except for China, India, Brazil and Russia that are considered as regions. The rule is minimum 2 partners from two different provinces or oblats or states from these countries.

FP7n – SP Cooperation

- Energy in the 7th Framework Programme
 - Dedicated Theme ENERGY THEME of the Cooperation Programme (Budget: 2.3 million €)
 - → Addressed by many FP7 Themes and activities (e.g. Agriculture, Materials, Information Technologies, Transport, Research Infrastructures, Marie Curie etc.)




The Work Programme

- FP7 is implemented through competitive calls for proposals
- Content of the calls is based on the annual Work Programmes
- Terminology
 - → Theme (Energy)
 - → Activity (nine in the Energy Theme)
 - → Area (stable throughout FP7, but with flexibility)
 - → Topic (subjects open for proposals in the calls, only in the year in question)

Bi-regional Coordination of S&T cooperation

INCO-NETs are platforms bringing together policy makers and stakeholders of one target region/country with the EU to:

- ➤ Identify research needs and set S&T cooperation priorities for mutual benefit and interest; define cooperation policy orientations
- > Implement specific activities to promote the participation of the targeted regions/countries in the Framework Programme
- > Identify areas for enhanced co-ordination between Member States, Associated States and International Cooperation Partner Countries
- > Strengthening co-ordination and complementarities with activities carried out by means of Community foreign policy instruments

This call provides an opportunity for the INCO-NET projects selected in the first call (FP7-INCO-2007-1) to **expand** their geographical coverage and/or **deepen** their coordination and structuring activities







To promote improved cooperation in science and technology between Europe and Sub-Saharan Africa

The Joint Africa-EU_Strategy and Action Plan adopted at the Lisbon Summit in December 2007 set the goal to create a privileged partnership between the EU and Africa - including on "Science, Information Society and Space" (hereafter "8th partnership").

CAAST-Net Objectives

- To support and inform the Africa-Europe science and technology policy dialogue and cooperation processes.
- Identify and prioritize common research areas.
- Promote greater synergy between instruments for Europe-Africa S&T partnerships under the Framework Programme, and development cooperation instruments, notably the EDF.
- Improving the quality and quantity of coordinated practical support to Africa's participation in FP7.
- Monitor the performance and impact of Europe-Africa S&T cooperation and cooperation policy under FP6 and FP7.

- > Develop national information platforms;
- > Reinforce promotion and awareness activities;
- > Sharing best practices via joint for a such as workshops and presenting the state of the art and the prospects for cooperation in particular fields;
- > Assistance in forming research partnerships; etc...

ERA-NET

Coordination of national policies and activities on international S&T cooperation

Objective

➤To increase the cooperation and coordination of research programmes carried out at national or regional level in the MS and AS and which target one third country or several third countries in a given region

The main participants should be ministries, research councils or other funding agencies (research <u>programme "owners"</u> or <u>programme "managers"</u>)

CAPACITIES - International Cooperation ACCESS4EU – Objectives

Supporting the EU access to third country programmes

→ This activity aims at increasing the awareness and dissemination in the Member Sates and Associated Countries of access opportunities for European researchers and research organisations in national research and/or innovation programmes managed by third countries.





ACCESS4EU - Activities

- Mapping of the access opportunities in the target country;
- Dissemination of the results to European research organisations and multipliers (information and awareness activities in MS and AC, web...);
- Monitoring of the participation of researchers from the Member States and Associated Countries to the programmes managed by the target country;
- Provide a feedback for use by the Commission in the context of the Joint Committee meetings of the S&T agreements and make appropriate recommendation to ensure matching reciprocity from the target country.

CAPACITIES - International Cooperation ERA-WIDE, INCO-2010

Reinforcing cooperation with Europe's neighbours in the context of the ERA (ERA-WIDE):

Objective:

To reinforce the cooperation capacities of research centres located in the ENP countries, which are not associated to FP7, in the areas of the thematic priorities of FP7.





ERA-WIDE – Country coverage

ERA-WIDE proposals should target only one of the following countries:

Mediterranean Partner Countries:

Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, Jordan, Occupied Palestinian Territory, Lebanon, Syria

Eastern Europe and South Caucasus:

Moldova, Georgia, Ukraine, Belarus, Armenia, Azerbaijan





ERA-WIDE Participants profile

- The call is addressed to research centres of proven high level S&T capacities, which are located in an ENP country not associated to FP7;
- The proposal should target only one such centre;
- The consortium should however include additional participants, in particular from the MS and/or AC so as to fulfil the objectives of the activity;
- The research centre targeted by the proposal must be the coordinator of the proposal.



ERA-WIDE - Activities

ERA-WIDE actions:

- Networking with research centres in MS or AC in view of disseminating scientific information, identifying partners and setting up joint experiments;
- Developing training modules to build competency and facilitate the participation of these centres in FP7;
- Developing research centres' strategy in order to increase their scope (regional coverage, activities) and to improve their responses to the socio-economic needs of their countries and of the region.
